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FYI: Project Bike Tech/Outdoor Recreation Career Pathway:

Tri-County Cap and NH's Outdoor Mobility Office has asked our Bike Tech program to use our bicycle technician skills to repair bicycles that have been donated to provide bikes to community members in need free of charge. Our students will work on the bikes, overseen by their instructor, Chris Darling. This is an excellent work-based learning opportunity for our up-and-coming bike techs. Supplies and materials to fix the donated bicycles will be donated by Tri-County Cap and the Mobility Office (region 2). Approximate value donation of supplies and materials = \$1000.

Criminal Justice (Terry Ballou): Junior Aela Robinson is currently doing an internship with the Carroll County Prosecutor's Office. Senior Liam Thompson is starting an ELO with defense attorney Don Ekberg. More and more students are expressing interest in all areas of criminal justice (courts, law enforcement and corrections) so we are really ramping up our efforts to find more internship opportunities.

Teacher Education (Kelley Murphy): We have returned to the middle school...our first visit since the pandemic hit. Although early adolescence is not ideal for all, they loved connecting with another set of teachers and seeing this unique age group in action. Recently the students read Jim Garvin's Learning to Kiss A Frog and had to recreate the cover based on their thoughts and experiences in middle school, thereby creating a new metaphor to explain middle school kiddos.

Construction Trades (Paul Cail): We are currently in the process of putting the finishing touches on three unique sheds for various customers. These sheds include a "She Shed," which is quite ornate, a "He Shed," and a "Gothic Shed." Once completed, the sheds will be wired for electricity. Each shed has different carpentry applications per customers' wishes. This provides our students with many opportunities to practice carpentry skills. Our greenhouse is a busy place. We are preparing to clean out the winter veggies like kale, bok choy, basil, and cilantro. We will start growing tomatoes and peppers this week. We are sharing the greenhouse with Sierra Hopkins and her students as they will plant pollinating plants to attract bees, butterflies, etc. Mr. Cail has an after-school program with six students on Mondays. We are working on fine home-building skills like trim, cabinets, doors, etc. Further, Mr. Cail started a fly-fishing club that meets once a week, and we plan to make a couple of trips up north to test our newly learned skills.

Visual Media (Abbey Donaldson): Each spring, a nationwide high school arts competition is sponsored by Members of the U.S. House of Representatives in collaboration with the Congressional Institute. The competition is an opportunity to recognize and encourage the artistic talent in the nation, as well as in

our Congressional District. Congressman Chris Pappas welcomes participation by high school students who attend schools in or live in New Hampshire's First Congressional District. Four awards, in total, are awarded. First, Second, and Third place as well as Staff Favorite. Out of the four awards, two of our students were honored: Sophie Odell, a senior, placed third and Trinity Butler, a senior won Staff Favorite. Sophia's work will be displayed in Congressman Pappas' Manchester office for one year. The awards ceremony was held on May 1st in Concord.
